

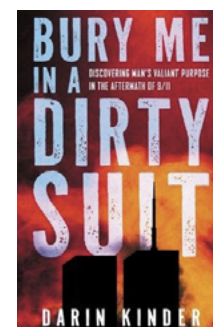

Storytime Room

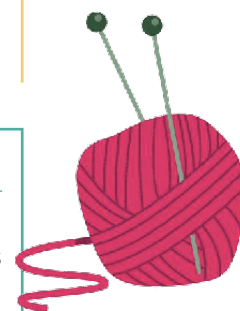
Join us for a family storytime program geared toward children ages 3-6 years. All children must be accompanied by at least one adult. No residency or registration requirement to attend.

READ, LISTEN AND WATCH

LIBBY

Use Libby to borrow e-books and e-audiobooks with a Richardson Public Library card. It is a good option for popular fiction, nonfiction, children's books, teen books and audiobooks. Titles can be read or listened to on a phone, tablet, computer or e-reader.

HOOPLA

Gives Richardson residents instant access to digital movies, music, magazines, e-books, e-audiobooks and comics. Some items are available without wait lists, making it a good option for families, casual readers and anyone looking for quick access to digital entertainment.

NEWSBANK

Provides access to local, national and international news sources. Patrons can use it to read current news, research past events or look up archived articles, including access to publications such as *The Dallas Morning News* and the *Richardson Echo* Historical Archive.

LIBRARY SERVICES

The Library offers a number of services to cardholders. Among the services offered are:

BOOK A LIBRARIAN

The Book a Librarian service offers a free 30-60 minute appointment with a knowledgeable librarian. We are here to assist you with your personal, educational and business information needs. Feel free to contact us if you need help finding a good book or using our resources to find information.

BOOKS BY MAIL

The Library offers Books by Mail services to homebound patrons, making Library materials available to those who are unable to visit the Library in person due to short- or long-term disabilities. Audiobooks and nonfiction DVDs—as well as regular and large print books—are all included in this service. Items ship and return in a prepaid envelope provided by the Library. Items check out monthly with materials due back four weeks after they are mailed.

CURBSIDE DELIVERY

Curbside Delivery is available for all cardholders during the following times:

Monday-Thursday: 9 a.m.-5:30 p.m.

Friday-Saturday: 10 a.m.-5:30 p.m.

Sunday: 2-5:30 p.m.

DROP-IN TECH HELP

Drop-in Tech Help is available every Thursday near the Questions Desk. No registration is required, just walk in and spend 5-15 minutes with a librarian to ask your tech questions.

INTERLIBRARY LOAN REQUESTS

When you make an InterLibrary Loan request, we request the item you want from libraries that own it. InterLibrary Loan is a free service. Some lending libraries charge a small fee, but we will ask you before choosing that option.

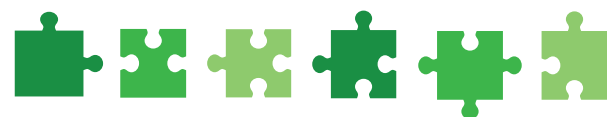
