Tweens read the best of the best books from award lists, lists curated by the Texas and American Library Associations and other top recommendations. Readers select a book each month and join the roundtable

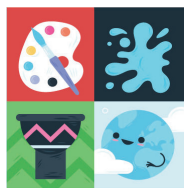
